Air Mauritius ensures Maintenance Support Services to Air Tanzania

Air Mauritius is presently undergoing maintenance intervention on an Airbus A 320 of Air Tanzania at its Technical Services Facilities - Sir Seewoosagur Ramgoolam International Airport, Plaine Magnien, for tasks that cannot be performed at Dar-es-Salaam.

Air Mauritius has started to ensure Maintenance Support Services for one Airbus A320 aircraft operated by Air Tanzania at its main base at Julius Nyerere International Airport, Dar-es-Salaam since 25th May 2008.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed by Air Tanzania Corporation and Air Mauritius Limited in February 2008, where Air Mauritius is to provide Maintenance Management Services (MMS). *“Technical Services from Air Mauritius are excellent, good in decisions and are reliable”*, states Mr. Charles Urasa, Air Tanzania Technical Representative.

The agreement covers engineering, configuration management and fleet management, Maintenance Support Services (MSS), production planning and Maintenance Control Center, Maintenance Services (MS) production and Information Technologies Services (ITS).

“Air Mauritius has been an operator of Airbus since 1994 and today we have adequate capabilities and expertise which we can share with our African neighbours. We are very pleased to welcome Air Tanzania, our first customer in Africa at our maintenance facilities”, says Mr. Jacques Gentil, Executive Vice-President – Technical Services.

Air Mauritius Technical Representatives are also to provide on-the-job training to Air Tanzania Technical Personnel. Presently the aircraft is in Mauritius undergoing maintenance intervention for tasks that cannot be performed at Dar-es-Salaam.
